- 3. ONLY ONE ENTRY FROM EACH ADDRESS PER CLASS ALLOWED, other than in the Rose section Star Classes
- 4. The Harvest Pavilion will be open from Noon on **Thursday**, **26**th **September until 6.30am on Friday 27**th **2024 for exhibitors to stage**. Security staff will be in attendance throughout the night. However, stewards will only be on duty during the following times to give advice and issue exhibit cards on **Thursday**, **26**th **September noon to 10.00pm**, **Friday**, **27**th **September 2024**, **6.00am to 6.30am**. The Harvest Pavilion will be electrically illuminated throughout the night. All exhibitors must leave the Marquee by 6.30am. Judging will commence at 7.00am.

PLEASE NOTE THE HARVEST PAVILION IS LOCATED BY THE YELLOW GATE – NORTH END OF THE SHOWGROUND.

- 5. Exhibits should be NAMED where possible for the interest and education of onlookers. All exhibits in Alpine classes **must** be named. Variety cards will be available from the Stewards.
- 6. **VASES WILL BE AVAILABLE FOR CUT FLOWERS**, but exhibitors may supply their own.

Please see rule 21 FLORAL FOAM.

- 7. The Society and Committee will take every reasonable care but will not be responsible for any loss or damage.
- 8. Please place exhibits in a saucer, if you wish your entry to be watered during the Show.
- 9. The decision of the Judges is final. They have power to withhold any award if the exhibits are deemed to be unworthy.
- 10. Exhibits and prize cards **must not** be removed until after **4.30pm** on **Sunday 29th September 2024.** Failure to comply will forfeit prize money. The Society and Committee will try to ensure the safety of all exhibits, but no responsibility will be taken for any loss or damage. Stewards will be in attendance until 6pm.
- 11. IF EXHIBITORS ARE UNABLE TO STAGE THEIR EXHIBIT/S, WOULD THEY PLEASE INFORM THE SHOW OFFICE BY TUESDAY, **24**th **SEPTEMBER 2024**
- 12. Any objection must be made in writing to the Show Secretary before 3.00pm on the first day of the Show, together with a deposit of £5.00, which will be retained if the objection is not upheld by the Committee.

- 13. Trophies will be presented to the winners in the Harvest Pavilion on **Sunday 29**th **September** at 4.15pm (and will then be retained by the Society). If you would like a photograph taken with your exhibit, please inform the steward at the desk.
- 14. Prize money will be paid by BACS after the show.
- 15. The Show is open to all exhibitors who need not be resident within the three counties of Herefordshire, Worcestershire or Gloucestershire.
- 16. Competitors entering in classes A1 A2, A3, F1, G1 and L23, will receive an admission pass. For all other classes, one 3-day show pass per exhibitor for not fewer than 5 entries.
- 17. One vehicle pass will be issued to exhibitors to enable them to deliver and collect their exhibits.

 Please use the Yellow Gate off Blackmore Park Road. Once delivery has been completed all vehicles

 must be removed from the showground to the car parks.

The appropriate wristbands will be given to exhibitors when they collect their class cards, in accordance with regulation 16. If you have also entered the CANNA UK Giant Vegetables Championship, your wristbands will be issued with the Exhibit cards for the Giant Vegetable section.

- 18. Exhibitors wishing to park in the Harvest Pavilion car park must be in by 3pm on **Sunday 29**th **September 2024,** otherwise they will have to park in the Yellow car park and will not be allowed entry until 6.15pm. There will be no vehicle exits from the Harvest Pavilion car park between 8am and 6.15pm on Show days.
- 19. The Society's general show regulations will apply to this section. Copies are available from the main office.
- 20. All classes to be judged in accordance with the Royal Horticultural Society rules, 8th Edition, 2016, except where stated otherwise in the schedule.
- 21. RHS and Three Counties Society statement for Floral Foam 2024 Show Season:

As part of our efforts to improve sustainability and to make environmentally-minded choices we took the decision to ban ALL plastic containing foam at all shows in 2024. Many current flora foams on the market are non-biodegradable and use micro-plastics and due to nature of its use is very easy for these to get into the water supplies. We have taken the decision in consultation with exhibitors, competitors, venues, and site managers.

What are the alternatives? There are several great floristry resources online proposing alternatives. Permissable alternatives include:

Chicken Wire or Metal Pins (kenzan)

Moss

Green Foliage

Tubes and Water

Newspaper

Marbles

Pebbles
